## The Last Five Years

by Jason Robert Brown

Modern musical ingeniously chronicles the five-year life of a marriage.

Drama Desk award-winner *The Last Five Years* is Jason Robert Brown's intimate window into a couple's doomed marriage. Cathy, a struggling actress, and Jamie, a budding novelist on the brink of wild success, are 20-somethings in New York who meet, fall in love, marry, and divorce over the span of five years. Cathy tells the story from the end of their marriage; Jamie begins when they first meet. As the musical unfolds, Cathy moves backward in time to the beginning of the relationship, as Jamie moves forward from their first date to their last goodbye; they meet only once, in the middle, at their wedding. Since its Off-Broadway premiere, Brown's funny, poignant, and devastatingly honest two-person production has enraptured audiences around the world with its spellbinding and emotional score and libretto.



"JASON ROBERT BROWN is the ultimate multihyphenate – an equally skilled composer, lyricist, conductor, arranger, orchestrator, director and performer – best known for his dazzling scores to several of the most renowned musicals of our time, including the generation-defining *The Last Five Years*, his debut song cycle *Songs for a New World*, and the seminal *Parade*, now on Broadway in a spectacular Tony Award-winning revival directed by Michael Arden, for which he won the 1999 Tony Award for Best Score."

Notable roles include Jamie in The Last Five Years, Barfée in Spelling Bee, Snoopy in You're a Good Man Charlie Brown, Gould in Grey Gardens, Yvan in ART, Vanya in Life Sucks,

Karl/Steve in Clybourne Park, and Valentine in Babes in Arms.
